### G1 Survey of staffing levels and facilities in Scottish renal units in August 2007

The facilities and staffing in Scottish renal units were surveyed on 30 August 2007 by distribution of a questionnaire to all units. The response rate was 100%.

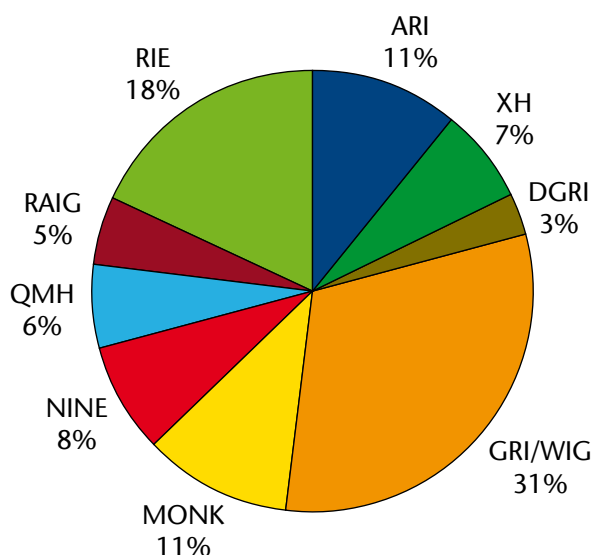
On the survey day there were 10 parent units (nine adult and one paediatric) and 18 satellite units. The results are shown in the following graphs. They are divided into a number of areas: medical staffing; provision of in-patient facilities; provision of renal replacement therapy – haemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis.

The RHSC provides renal care for all children in Scotland. For ease of comparison, results for both the paediatric and the adult units, refer to the general population.

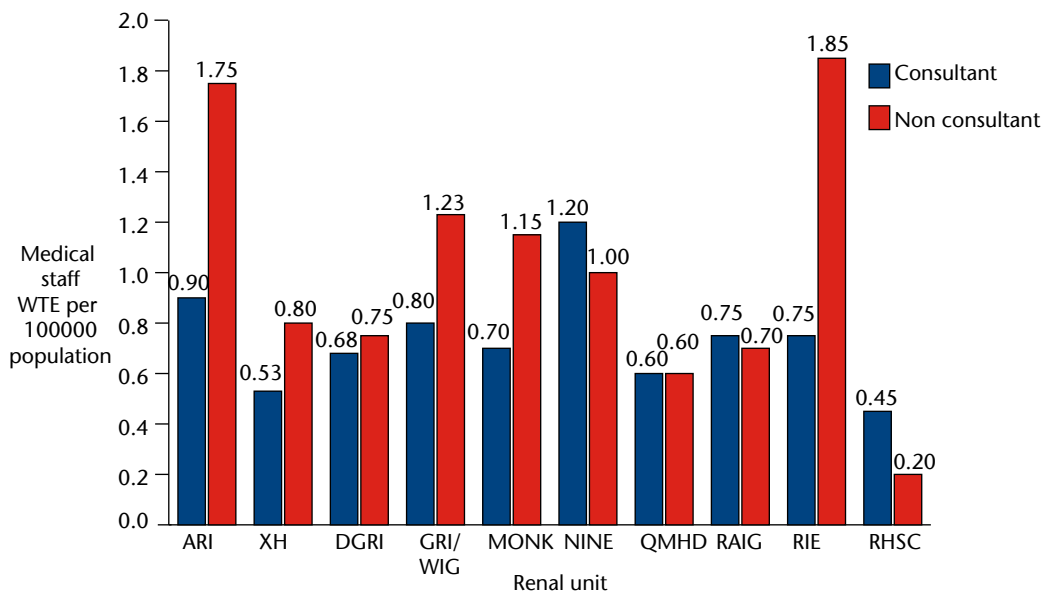

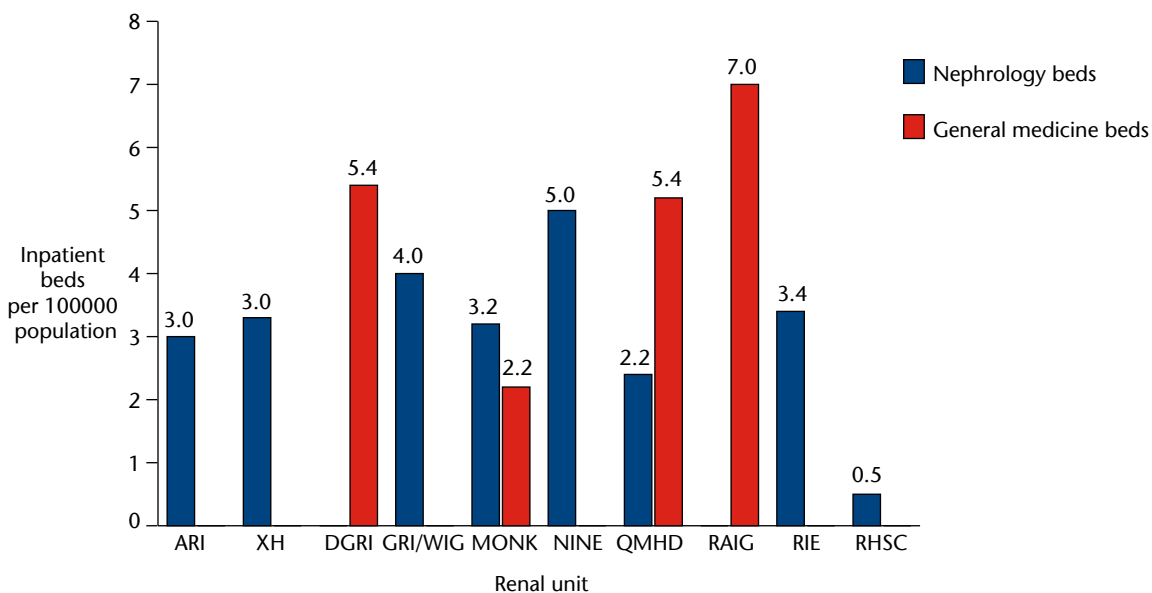
#### G1.1 Proportion of the adult population served by each renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007



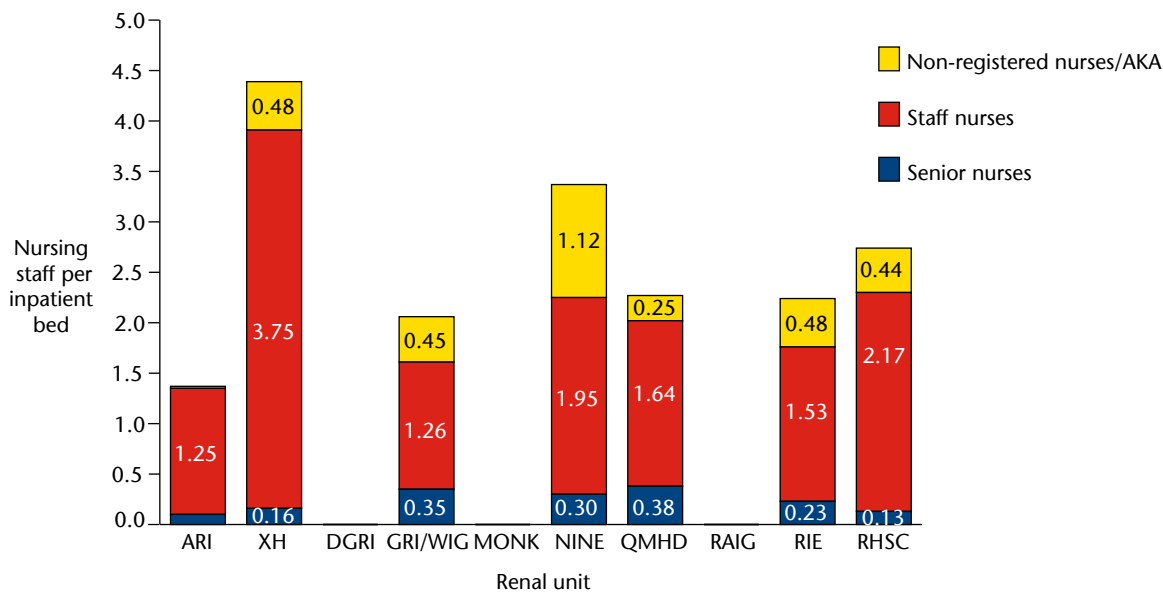
**G1.2 Number of consultant and non-consultant medical staff (WTE) per 100000 general population by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



**G1.3 Number of in-patient beds available per 100000 population by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**

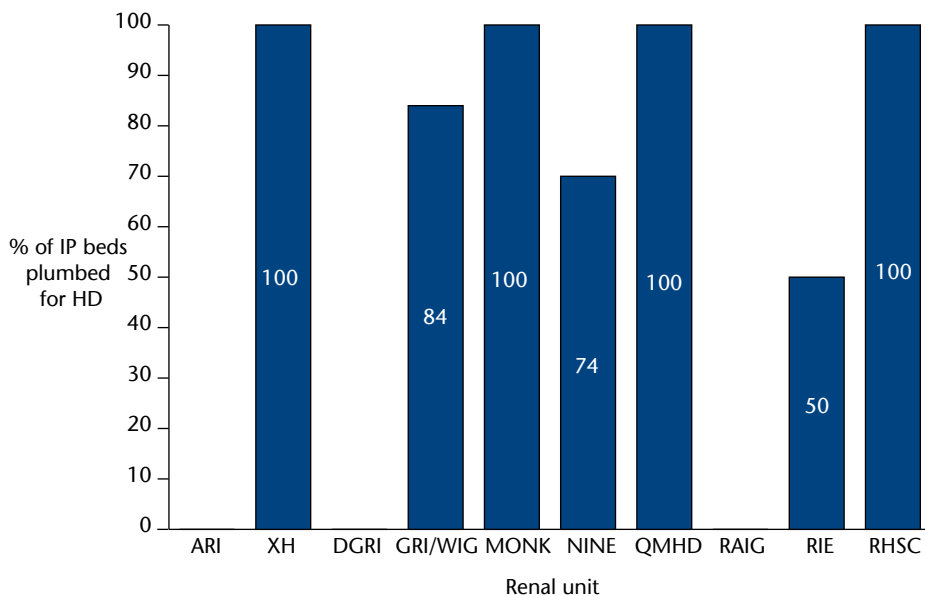


**G1.4 Number of renal ward nursing staff per inpatient bed by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



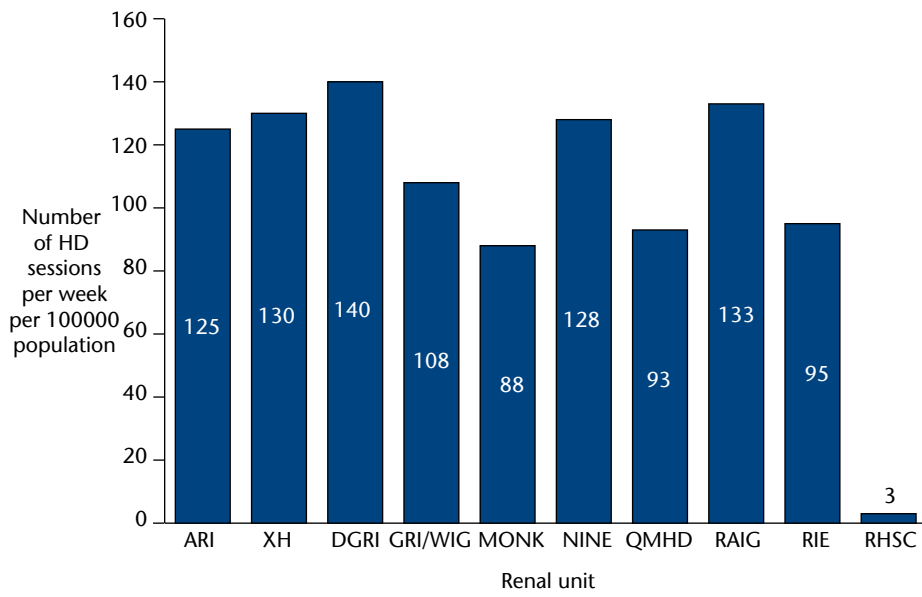

**G1.5 Percentage inpatient beds plumbed for haemodialysis by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**

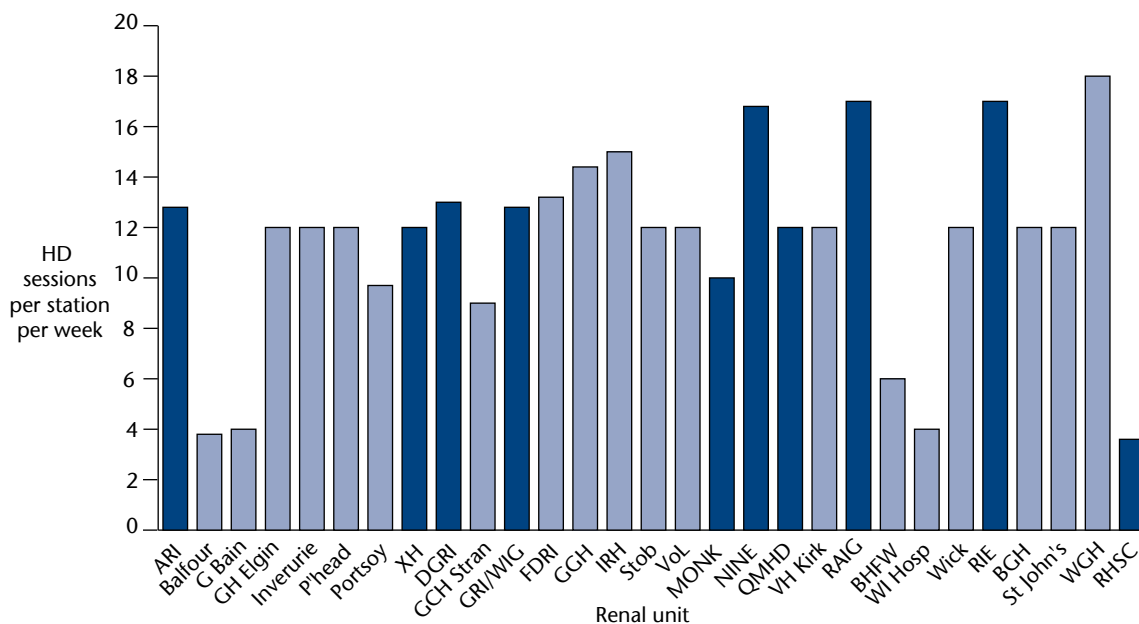

**G1.6 Number of HD sessions available per 100000 population per week by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



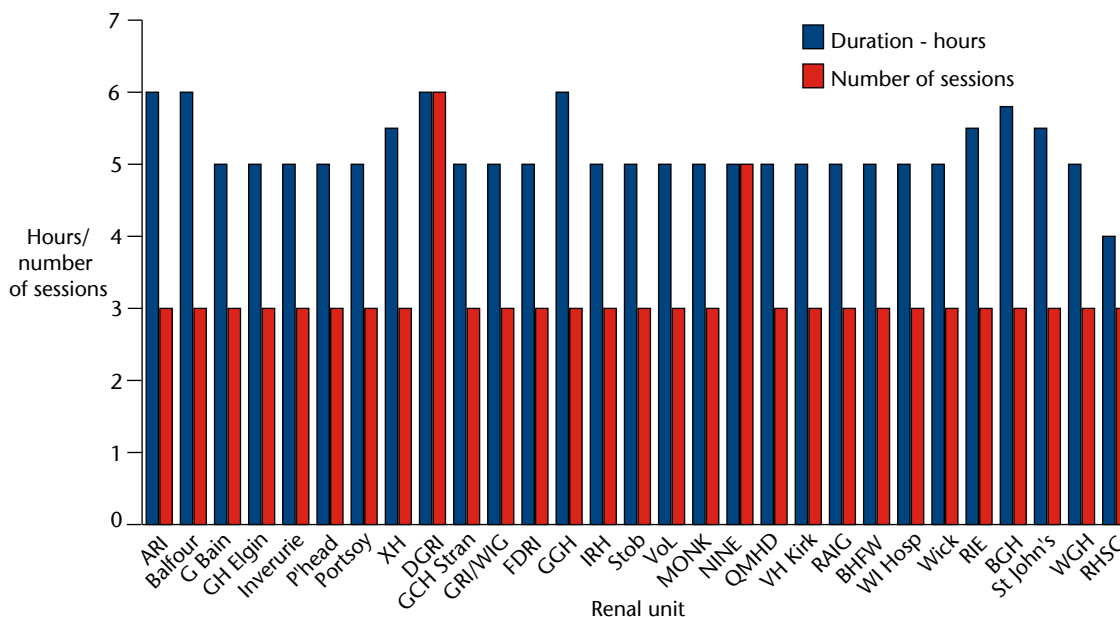
**G1.7 Number of HD sessions per HD station per week by parent unit and satellite unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



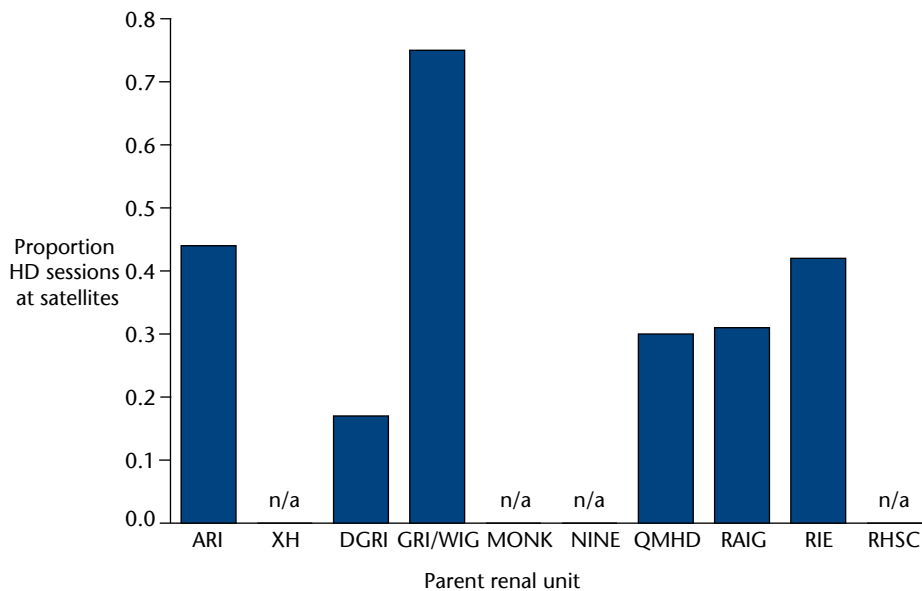

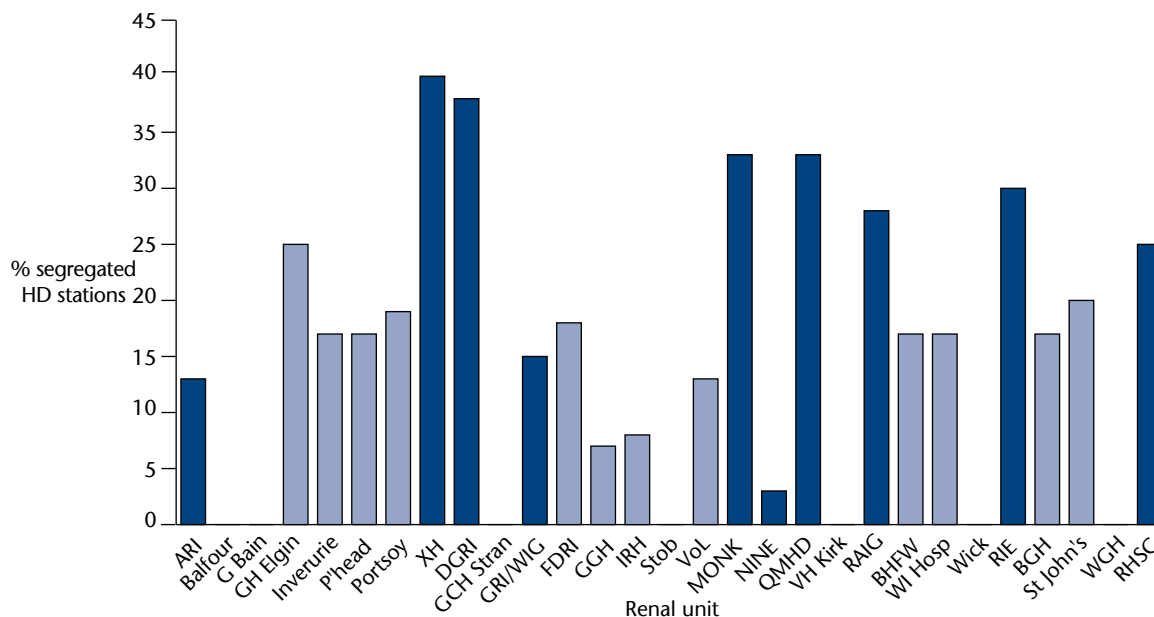
**G1.8 Maximum duration and number of HD sessions offered by renal units in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



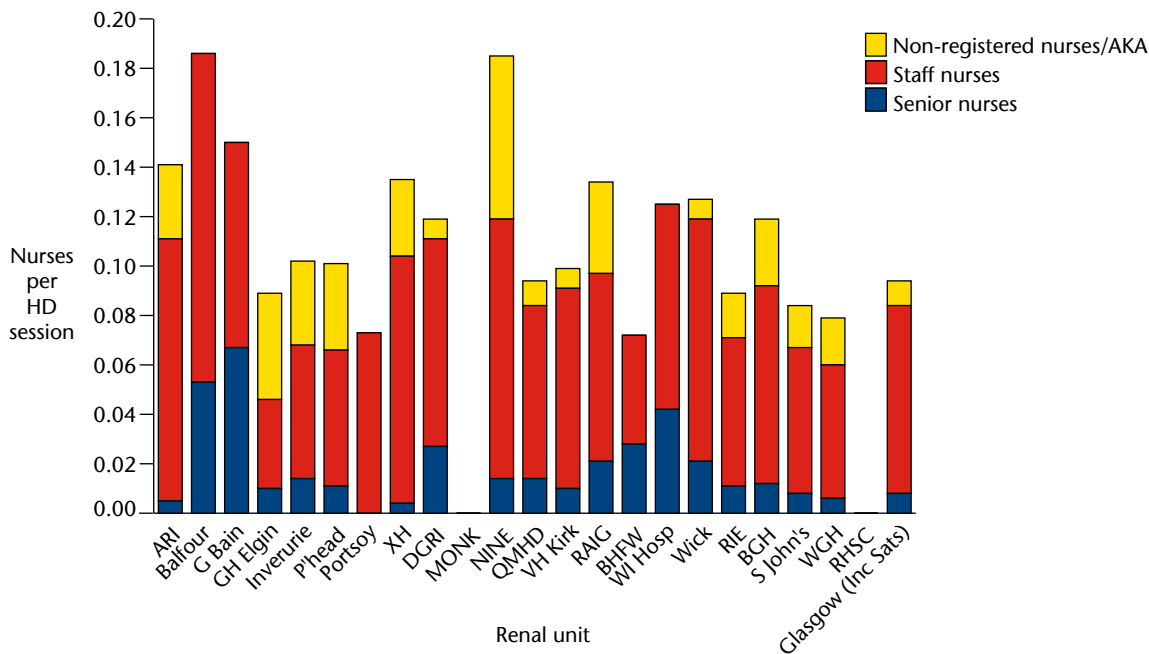
**G1.9 Proportion of HD sessions provided in satellite units by parent renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**



**G1.10 Percentage HD stations segregated for infection control by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**

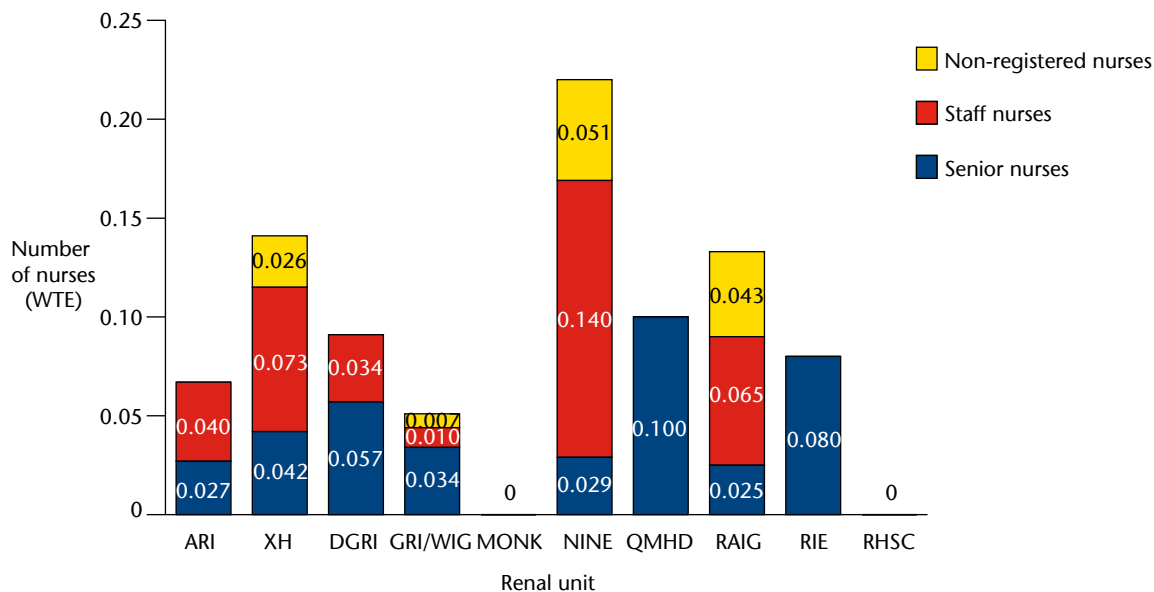


**G1.11 Number of HD nurses per HD session by renal unit in Scotland on 30 August 2007**

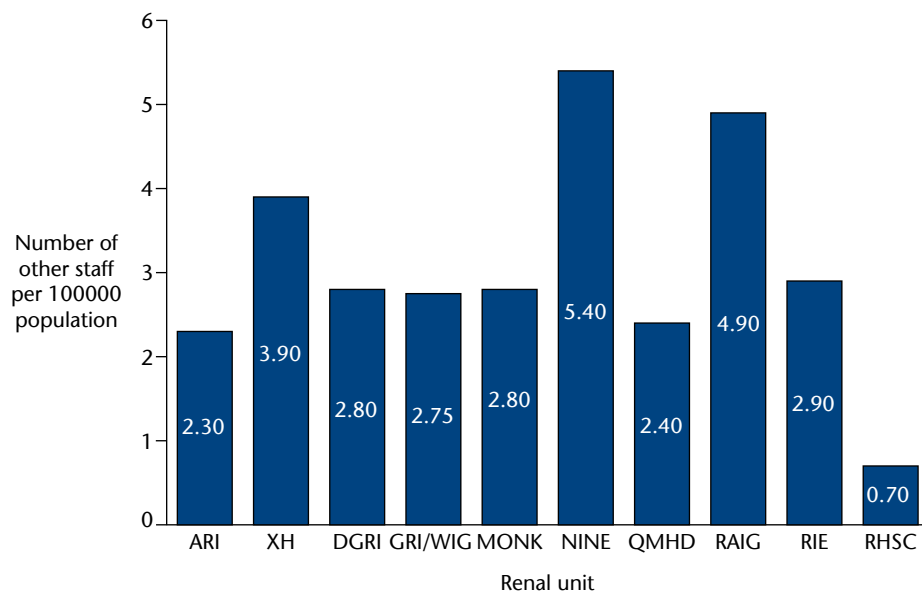


Glasgow Units and Satellites are grouped together as nursing staff may work in multiple units
